This category is open to any and all individuals and groups that have made a noteworthy contribution to the careful stewardship, wise planning or artful design of our cultural and/or natural environment.

SUBMITTAL FORMAT

Each submittal must include: 1) complete entry form, 2) entry fee and 3) Microsoft PowerPoint presentation submitted on a compact disk **OR** a written description of the nominee and their contribution. The description should not exceed two double spaced pages. Attach any photographs, news articles or any other item that would help to describe their contribution.

- Maximum size: 20 slides.

Entry Requirements

Professional Awards

The New York Upstate Chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects, in an effort to encourage the participation and recognition of Landscape Architects and to better familiarize the public with their activities and projects, announces the Annual Awards Program for 2009. The program recognizes a full spectrum of innovative projects and efforts executed by individuals, firms, agencies, and academic institutions.

AWARDS

Honor Award of Excellence

An award for projects representing the highest professional standards.

Merit Award of Achievement

An award recognizing professional work of significant quality, innovation or professional impact.

Community Achievement Award

A category for any group or individual (landscape architect or not) that has made a noteworthy contribution to the landscape. (see back page)

PROFESSIONAL AWARD CATEGORIES

- 1. Built Design** • This category includes streetscapes, waterfronts, park and recreation projects, commercial and industrial projects, subdivisions and residential developments.
- 2. Unbuilt Design** • This category includes conceptual and developed designs prepared for a client, but never constructed.
- 3. Residential Garden Design** • Residential garden/landscape projects.
- 4. Planning & Analysis** • Including transportation/urban/regional/community planning, government policies, programs or regulations.
- 5. Research, Historic Preservation, and Communication** • Category includes research projects that address challenges posed in landscape architecture; historic resources inventories and all other restoration and/or preservation projects; and communication of landscape architecture history, theory or practice to those within or outside the profession.

Professional projects must be submitted by an individual registered as a Landscape Architect in New York State who is a member of ASLA and maintains a work address in Upstate New York. The project must have been completed since January 1, 2004. Any project that has previously won an ASLA award is ineligible. Entries will be judged by a multidisciplinary jury from outside the NY Upstate Chapter ASLA.

SUBMITTAL FORMAT

Each submittal must include: 1) entry form, 2) entry fee, 3) Microsoft PowerPoint presentation, individual high resolution images, and narrative as Word file submitted on CD, 4) printout of slides.

- Maximum size: 20 slides.
- All PowerPoint slides must use the NYUASLA's templates. To download templates please visit <http://www.nyuasla.org/>.
- All logos or other markings that identify the entrant must be removed or masked from view.

- SLIDE #1:**
- Project name and location.
 - Project purpose: scope, philosophy and intent.
- SLIDE #2:**
- Role of landscape architect vs. other participants.
- SLIDE #3**
- Special factors: unique features or unusual problems.

SLIDES # 4 - 20

- Provide images and text describing the project (multiple images on a slide is acceptable).
- Your presentation should be all inclusive of your project. The jurors will be reviewing each project by means of your slides and descriptive data only, and may not be familiar with Upstate New York geography.
- Optional: entrant may prepare a 1-page description of the image slides and enclose it with the project narrative described below.

PROJECT NARRATIVE

Please provide a 1-page narrative covering the following:

- Project name and location.
- Purpose of project, including project's requirements, scope, planning or design philosophy and design intent.
- Role of the entrant.
- Significance/special factors: relationship of the project to its context, unique features, unusual constraints, stewardship role.
